**Rita Malhotra, RN, Named Director
of Nursing at Saratoga Health Center**

SARATOGA – The Saratoga Retirement Community Health Center has a new director of nursing services. "Rita Malhotra, RN, joined the Health Center Family on May 3, and she has already made some great improvements effecting the health center as a whole" said Administrator Gary Vernon. She was born in Kanpur, India, and raised in New Delhi, joined the Military Nursing Services in 1979 and was commissioned a lieutenant in 1982. She reached the rank of captain in 1990, was married and came to the United States in 1991. She has been working with seniors since 1992.

Upon coming to the United States, she could not practice as an RN since there is no reciprocity between the two countries. Not letting a minor thing like that stop her, she started out as a certified nurses aide, passed her LVN boards and challenged the RN boards to regain her status. After working for a time as a charge nurse for an area nursing home chain, she was promoted to assistant director of nurses. Seeing her potential they sent her to their intensive Director of Nurses School for 11 weeks back east. Shortly thereafter she was transferred by her company to a facility in Walnut Creek, as the director.

She responded to an ad for a position of director of nurses from the Saratoga facility. After several interviews there was no question Rita Malhotra was the director the Saratoga Home was looking for.

"I suggested to Rita to take a little time and make her own observations about what needs to be done and what she wanted to do to improve the quality of life for our residents and staff. She did that in short order and atmosphere in the health center has improved significantly already." said Brother Vernon. She is definitely a hands on director who is out amongst the residents and staff dealing with issues on the spot. When it comes to quality care, she does not take no for an answer.
